

Doris Gorka Bartuska, MD, FACP, FACE

Dr. Bartuska is currently Emeritus Professor of Medicine (Endocrinology) at Drexel University School of Medicine, formerly the Medical College of Pennsylvania/Hahnemann University. She has been the Director of the Division of Endocrinology, Diabetes and Metabolism and the Fellowship Training Program at the Medical College of Pennsylvania. She is known in academia as a consultant in endocrine and rare metabolic disorders. Her research focused on the genetic aspects of endocrine diseases, endocrinology and aging, osteoporosis and thyroid diseases. She is the author of numerous publications in the field. She holds board certification in internal medicine and endocrinology and metabolism.

Dr. Bartuska graduated from Bucknell University and obtained her MD degree from the Woman's Medical College of Pennsylvania (WMC), now Drexel University College of Medicine, where she had a rotating internship and fellowship and residency in medicine. She then was an NIH trainee in endocrinology at Jefferson Medical College. Dr. Bartuska was Assistant and Associate Dean in Medicine at mc. In 1966, she embarked on a two-year Special NIH Fellowship in Molecular Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania. She was Associate Dean for the Curriculum at MCP.

Her ability and dedication as a teacher were recognized by numerous awards including the Strittmatter Award presented by the Philadelphia County Medical Society, the Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society, the Lindback Distinguished Teaching Award for her work at the Medical College of Pennsylvania and was named an Outstanding Educator of America and a Distinguished Daughter of Pennsylvania. She received the Shaffrey Award from St. Joseph's University, an honorary Doctor of Science from Wilkes University, the Alumni-Achievement Award from Bucknell University.

She is Past Present of the Medical Staff at the Medical College of Pennsylvania and served a President of the American Medical Women's Association in 1988. As AMWA President, she focused on stimulating national interest in a woman's health agenda with particular emphasis on the prevention and treatment of osteoporosis and smoking and smoke-related disease. She served as President of The Philadelphia County Medical Society and the Philadelphia Endocrine Society. She has also been cited in the World Who's Who of American Women and the World Who's Who of Women. Her involvement in medical humanities and medical ethics led to participation in the President's Forum on Physicians and Society Responsibility. Dr. Bartuska continues to be a leader in organized medicine and currently serves as Delegate to the Pennsylvania Medical Society and the Committee to Nominate Delegates to the American Medical Association.

Dr. Bartuska is proud of her Polish heritage and enjoys Polish music and dance. She is an accomplished musician having studied piano, organ and coloratura voice. She is the mother of six children and nine grandchildren.
